


Join us for the 2024 Johns Hopkins Updates in Gastrointestinal (GI) Cancers, a two-day educational event focused on the latest information and updates in gastrointestinal cancers.

This two-day conference is designed to meet the needs of all healthcare providers involved in the care and management of patients with GI cancers.

Last year's conference was a great success, with over 120 attendees participating in the live in-person event. The goal for 2024 will be to increase our live attendance from the surrounding Baltimore/DC areas. We had a diverse set of professionals in the field of GI cancers, whose demographics are reflected in the included chart.



A total of 255 attendees participated in the Virtual Live meeting representing 22 countries.



Last year's conference was a huge success with approximately 375 registrants, which doubled our expectations for a first time meeting.

The Need

2023 Attendee Demographics

GI cancers, as a group, are the most common and most deadly cancers worldwide. While treatments have improved for these cancers, more than 171,000 people die each year in the United States from GI cancers. Fortunately, over the last several years, we have witnessed significant progress in our ability to extend survival, and even improve cure rates for patients with gastroesophageal, pancreatic, hepatobiliary, neuroendocrine, and colorectal cancers.

For example, the addition of immune checkpoint inhibitors has improved the outcomes of patients with operable and metastatic gastroesophageal cancer, advanced biliary tract cancers, and hepatocellular cancer. Researchers at Johns Hopkins are actively expanding on those findings with clinical trials that are aimed at further improving response and cure rates. Similarly, Johns Hopkins researchers have played key roles in clinical trials of biomarker directed therapies. Most notably, this includes, most notably clinical trials that changed the standard of care by proving that immune checkpoint inhibitors are highly effective for the subgroup of patients whose tumors demonstrate high degrees of microsatellite instability (MSI-high). It also includes trials that have shown great promise in the use of platinums and poly adenosine diphosphate-ribose polymerase (PARP) inhibitors in DNA damage response and repair deficient pancreatic cancers.

One consequence of the myriad of new clinical data in GI cancers is that it is becoming more and more difficult for a practicing oncologist, particularly one who does not specialize only in GI cancers, to stay up to date with all of the new findings. Similarly, the data can be even more overwhelming for GI cancer patients and caregivers, who are often trying to learn as much as they can about their (or their loved one's) disease.

Therefore, healthcare providers, patients, and caregivers need an educational forum wherein they can be updated regularly on the latest clinical evidence and treatment options for GI cancers. As demonstrated by the success of last year's conference, many attendees reported appreciating this conference as a resource to network with colleagues and expand their understanding of burgeoning updates in research for their field.
